**Friskney WI's** speaker was Carole Goulding, the owner of Grandma's Pudding Company tearoom in Friskney, which is a not for profit, specialist tearoom supporting learning disabled adults. Carole gave a very interesting, illustrated, talk on the history of the tearoom, and its plans for the future. There have been many problems along the way, but it is now a very popular and successful venture. It is staffed by young adults with various learning disabilities, who have all proved to be very efficient and accomplished in their duties.

Heighington WI report the scheduled speaker was unable to make it, so president Helen Keyworth, who is a bee keeper, gave a fascinating talk full of bee facts and her experience in working with hives over many years. Did you know that in the height of summer there is an average of 35,000 to 40,000 bees in a hive, but over the winter this falls to around 5,000 and that the vast majority of them are female all descending from one Queen Bee? Or that, the male drone bees are so called because when they collectively leave the hive they make a noise similar to a drone? Bees are essential to pollinate our crops and will fly up to 3 miles from the hive to find pollen to bring back to the hive, where it is used to feed the lava. As a type of pollinator, bees drink the sweet nectar of flowers, moving between plants and transferring pollen, which fertilises different species, enabling them to produce fruit and seeds. We can all help bees thrive (and by extension us!) by planting single bloom variety of flowers and mixture of plants that bloom all year round.

At **South Elkington WI** 6 members of South Reston WI joined them for the evening to hear Chris Cade , an actor and story teller, give a vision of life as seen from the Butlers pantry in 1871. Members were to imagine themselves as applicants for the job of junior house-maid. They would earn £4 per annum, work 14/16 hours a day and get 2 days off a year. Their duties were outlined very precisely in a most enjoyable and entertaining presentation.



#### Spa Afternoon WI's speaker

Mark was accompanied by his Guide Dog Dougal. He gave a very personal and emotional talk about coping with sight loss through a rare hereditary disorder, SMD. He also told of the lengthy process to find the right dog for him and what a difference Dougal has made to his life. They also held an informal AM in March. Members brought items for the Premature Baby Units at local hospitals and they have a few corgis ready to hide around the village, with more promised.
